# [ANSWERS] Part II "Should You Make the First Move on a Guy?"

Let's now look at what you can say to get some conversation going.

### **Conversation Starters**

I realize that starting a conversation with a man might seem intimidating, but it's quite simple.

None of these will irritate or offend him.

Successful conversationalists find ways to get people to talk, they do not "talk themselves out" of talking- they do not look for excuses to avoid a conversation.

Just get the ball rolling or nothing will happen.

Then you just see where things go.

At the end of this document we will look at how to exchange information if things seem to go well.

# **Comments or Questions**

These are basic conversation-starting tips, but effective nonetheless. Find something to comment on or ask him about. Position yourself close by. Be on the lookout for men within your vicinity at all times.

When you attend an event, take a walk, visit the store, go to a happy hour or coffee shop, look around first before choosing where to sit or walk.

Look where handsome and interesting-looking men sit.

I'm asking you to get more observant.

Naturally, it will be easier to hold a conversation in places and situations where you both are seated.

However, as long as the conversation is started and he is at least somewhat interested, even in situations where you're standing or walking can turn into an exchange of contact information.

Here is what I want you to be observant of and some examples how to start the conversation.

Yes, these are straight forward and simple, but they work.

What is he wearing?

(Sport paraphernalia) "Hello, I noticed your (x) hat/shirt. Are you from (x)?"

What is he looking at?

(Menu on wall) "They've got some great seasonal selections today, don't they? What do you think looks best?"

What are some of the things going on in the immediate surroundings?

(After listening to a speaker at a conference/convention) "What did you think of that speech?"

What comments does he make to others around him?

(After a new hire group training session) "Sounds exciting, doesn't it? What made you come work here?"

What is he drinking?

(At an upscale lounge during happy hour) "Wow, that looks good which drink is that?" Then ask him what his favorite drink is, and what he likes about it.

## What is he carrying or holding?

(Working on a tablet while in a seating area) "Excuse me, I don't mean to interrupt, but which tablet is that?" Followed up by, "I'm think of getting a new tablet, what do you think about that one?"

None of these techniques are flirty, but they are easy to do and can get the conversation going.

With men, just starting a conversation with us could be more than enough to attract us to you.

It feels like our lucky number turned up that day.

And don't think of this as impressing him as much as it is you qualifying him to see if you find him interesting enough to want to keep talking with and perhaps contact later.

#### Admiration

We cannot resist admiration. Us men love to the feeling of being good at something. It serves as a source of identity.

This conversation starter is a bit conditional. He has to do or say something that merits some kind of admiration.

- (A joke or funny situation he experienced) "Ha, ha. Wow! You're really funny. Your side hustle isn't stand-up comedy, is it?"
- (He discusses a dish he cooked) "Wow! That sounds delicious. You aren't a chef, are you?"

• (Places he's traveled to) "I'm so jealous! I've always wanted to go there. A jetsetter, are we?"

#### **Advice or Help**

And on par with our inability to resist admiration comes our weakness of wanting to advise someone or help them. (Look at me for example, I love advising you on how to win with men).

- (At a coffeeshop) "Looks like you come here often. Can I ask you for a suggestion, if I told you what I normally drink, could recommend one for me?"
- (At the grocery store) "Excuse me. Could you help a poor lady in need of some assistance? I wasn't born with the gift of height. Ha, ha. Could you grab that (x) from the top shelf for me." Then giggle.
- (At a conference or some kind of training) "You seem to have grasped this quite well. I'm still confused about something. Would you mind if I asked you a question?"

Again, most of these conversation-starting suggestions are pretty straight forward.

But do not underestimate the importance of getting the ball rolling.

And, as a reminder, with us men, it doesn't take much to get us to want to like a girl and want to talk with her later.

As long as, he is not already in love with someone else and in a committed relationship *AND* he finds you at least *somewhat* attractive, he will be turned on when you make the first move and he *WILL* want to talk to you later.

I purposely left out how to keep the conversation going, simply because it's too much to cover right now.

My main objective here is to focus on *when* and *how* you could make the first move on a man.
