[ANSWERS] Part III "Should You Make the First Move on a Guy?"

Let's start with a reminder.

Something even more important than the actual steps to take to meet them.

Mindsets.

Particularly the mindsets that will allow you to conquer fears of meeting new men and not worrying what happens next.

And then I'll touch on a couple mindsets to help you flirt more effectively that tend to get men to chase you from the beginning.

Avoiding (or Limiting) Rejection

One of the many reoccurring patterns I see happening with my subscribers or women I've known or observed personally is that they pay too much attention to his reaction.

And by this, I mean these women tend to be reactionary.

Reactionary women are hopeful that a man reacts in the way they want (likes them and that things go well).

Or the one who has spent time identifying the **compatibility traits** that she seeks in a man and will only get serious with a guy until after she spends time with him and he displays these traits will have an easier time protecting her boundaries and not getting emotionally attached.

How?

Because she will <u>more likely be able to detach herself</u> from the Mr. Wrongs- the ones who do not respect her boundaries or do not display the compatibility traits that she seeks.

This is where, for better or for worse, finding your true love comes down to, well, just that, *finding him*, *not making* him into Mr. Right.

Think of it like shucking oysters.

Does every oyster have a pearl?

No.

So, what do you have to do to find one that has a pearl?

Um, find one that has pearl.

Your Mr. Right is the pearl.

You have to find the pearl; you can't make it or build it.

Do not allow yourself to fall for the fun, charismatic, charming guy you recently met and then decide that me might be the "One, your Mr. Right.

He could be, or he might not be.

You don't know yet, so don't get all worked up and excited.

Mr. Right will NEVER reveal himself right away.

Let's face it.

How many guys do you think you could stomach dating for a few dates? A few weeks? A few months or perhaps for even a couple of years?

A lot actually.

Because you're not making a lifetime commitment.

It's easy to get excited for the guy that makes your hair stand on edge...

... in the beginning.

(I have a point. Keep reading.)

He WILL want to correct it because it feels awful to be called out. This will cause him to behave. This is a very specific form of earning your approval and respecting your boundaries.

Disapproval

Once you begin to date a man, then now more than ever, he must continue to work to earn your approval. Many of us guys know that women tend to reach an "emotional point of no return" where they fall for a guy so hard that they will put up with inconsistent, rude or even abusive behavior.

It's unfortunate for you. That's why you need to protect your boundaries. He does not want to hear how he has failed you. The right guy will stick around and try to make things right.
